- Partial government shutdown is affecting millions of Americans, including many in this district who have contacted my office
- First day of Congress, voted to reopen the government and fund the Department of Homeland Security through February
- Voted this week to reopen and fund Departments and agencies critical to the American people: transportation, housing, agriculture, food assistance, environmental inspections, FDA, national parks, among others.



- Not taking a paycheck until government shutdown is over
- Visited Chester County food bank
- Telephone roundtable with Chambers of Commerce
- Discussion with mushroom growers
- Office hours on shutdown
- Two town hall meetings in Wyomissing and Exton





- Support comprehensive, bipartisan immigration reform that keeps our nation safe and is consistent with American values
- Invest in border security that works: modern technology, fencing in high need areas, hiring and training personnel
- Address threats including narcotics trafficking at ports of entry
- Immigration reform that addresses visa overstays
- The bill I voted for my first week in Congress would reopen the government and provide billions to protect our country.



- Voted to defend protections for people with preexisting conditions under the Affordable Care Act
- Cosponsored two bills:
  - H.R. 1, reforms to help make government work better for the people, including improving voting access and curbing the influence of money in politics.
  - H.R. 8, to require universal background checks for gun purchases.
- Sent three letters:
  - Urging prioritization of the opioid epidemic in our policy agenda
  - Impact of shutdown on SNAP benefits
  - Protecting women's access to healthcare
