


WHO DO I REPRESENT?

Right now, the Pennsylvanian Sixth district includes all of **Chester County** and the southeastern part of **Berks County**, including the City of Reading. That's over 700,000 people!

However, the PA Supreme Court just approved updated congressional maps as a result of the 2020 census, which adds an additional area in Berks County. This will go into effect next year.



Houlahan Talks Financial Concerns, Inflation During Constituent Town Hall

- Co-Founded the Congressional Inflation Working Group
- Appointed to Conference Committee for the America COMPETES Act
- Addressing delays caused by inadequate systems that lead to bottlenecks and higher costs
- Passed: IIJA and the Ocean Shipping Reform Act

HEALTH CARE

- <u>Coverage increased by 21% due to the American Rescue Plan:</u> The increase to 14.5 million people represented a 21% increase over 2021 due to the expansions of cost-saving subsidies in the American Rescue Plan.
- Lowering Drug Costs by allowing Medicare to negotiate prescription drug prices
- Passed the Affordable Insulin Now Act to cap out of pocket insulin costs at \$35 per month
- Cosponsored the bipartisan **Telehealth Modernization Act**, which permanently removes Medicare's "geographic and originating site" restrictions, which require that the patient live in a rural area and use telehealth at a doctor's office or clinic.

GUN VIOLENCE PREVENTION

As a third-generation military veteran, I support the Second Amendment and responsible gun ownership. I also believe that Congressional action to reduce and prevent gun violence is long overdue, and I am committed to taking meaningful federal action to prevent future tragedies. This Congress I took the following steps to address this critical public safety and national security issue:

- Cosponsored and voted for the Bipartisan Background Checks Act, which ensures
 individuals prohibited from gun possession are not able to obtain firearms. This bill passed
 the House and has been placed on the Senate calendar for consideration.
- Voted for and an original cosponsor of the Enhanced Background Checks Act, which
 extends from three to ten days the time allowed for a background check to be conducted.
 The bill passed the House and has been placed on the Senate calendar for consideration.
- Cosponsored Ethan's Law, which enforces new standards for firearm storage in homes with children.
- Cosponsored more than 10 pieces of legislation that will help reduce and prevent gun
 violence in our communities, including bills that would ban assault weapons and highcapacity magazines and create programs for law enforcement to alert the public of active
 shooters in their communities
