ON IMPEACHMENT

- The Mueller Report lays out evidence that the President welcomed Russian interference and then may have obstructed justice to protect his interests
- Mr. Mueller's testimony re-emphasized that he was not able to exonerate the President, but rather that a Department of Justice policy precluded him from indicting a sitting President.
- This process is not over. Congress must continue its relentless and continued oversight pressure. We have to trust the process.
- This is a rapidly evolving investigation. Should the Administration prevent Congressional investigations from being fully carried out, prevent us from fully pursuing the truth, prevent us from upholding the mandates of the Constitution, I will reassess.



UPDATE FROM DC

- More than 250 bills passed the House, including:
 - H.R.1 For the People Act
 - An important government corruption and election reform package
 - Bills to defend protections for people with preexisting conditions and reduce the cost of prescription drugs
 - Historic background check legislation
 - The first time in 20 years that the House passed major gun safety legislation

 Fighting to increase access to affordable, quality care and to lower the cost of prescription drugs for our community

 If the ACA were repealed, 34,000 people in PA-06 would lose their healthcare

 Drug overdose deaths have increased in Chester County over the last several years



- Some of the healthcare bills we've passed in the House:
 - Strengthening Health Care and Lowering Prescription Drug Costs
 Act package of bills to reduce drug prices and improve
 access.
 - Middle Class Health Benefits Tax Repeal Act bipartisan bill to repeal the "Cadillac tax" on high value healthcare plans
 - Protecting Americans with Preexisting Conditions Act
 - Bills to expand care for:
 - People with autism
 - 9/11 First Responders
 - Veterans



Bills Cosponsored:

 Protecting Pre-existing Conditions & Making Health Care More Affordable Act

 Bolsters the ACA by continuing protections for consumers with pre-existing conditions, improving marketplace stability, and ensuring comprehensive benefits.

SAVE Act

 Gives states the authority to implement health care marketplaces, which can increase coverage options and bring down prices.

SPIKE Act

Requires more transparency in drug pricing.

- State Opioid Response Grant Authorization Act
 - Provides \$5 billion in federal grants to states for response to the opioid epidemic



- Hosted PA Attorney General Josh Shapiro, healthcare providers, and community leaders on the front lines of the opioid epidemic in Reading
- Visited Chester County Hospital and learned about a bold initiative to bring each medical specialty into the future
- Visited a community care clinic in West Chester that serves low-income and uninsured working families
